Chrystal has been a fighter ever since she was born with her umbilical cord wrapped around her neck. Mental illness and addiction deeply affected her family and childhood and continue to shape the course of her life. After she left home at a young age, she had to find a way to heal from a series of dark, traumatic experiences. As she looked through the scared eyes of a child for any reason to fight for life, for any reason she had survived so much pain, Chrystal found art.

Trigger Warning: The Progression of Healing showcases three collections of artwork Chrystal has made during her recovery from trauma over 30 years. Chrystal is now a mother and strives to give her children the perfect childhood she never had with a loving husband, a beautiful lakeside home with a country art studio near Alliance, Ohio, and a successful art career.

Fresh A.I.R. Gallery (Artists In Recovery) is a project of Southeast Healthcare and the gallery celebrates 17 years in 2021. The gallery's mission is to exhibit the work by individuals affected by mental illness and/or substance use disorders. Through art, we educate the community and work to break down the stigma of mental illness and/or substance use by bringing focus to the artist vision. Most pieces of art are all available for purchase, and Fresh A.I.R. Gallery does not take a commission, so all proceeds go directly to the artist.
